Who we are

SECRETARÍA DE SALUD DE PUEBLA (SSEP)

Cares for people in the state of Puebla without health insurance/social security provided through work. AMPATH/MAPAS México initially will work with two SSEP clinics and one casa de salud bringing clinical experts and students from BUAP to enhance clinical services at the community level.

DELL MEDICAL SCHOOL AT THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT AUSTIN

Dell Medical School at The University of Texas at Austin is on a mission to revolutionize how people get and stay healthy. The Division of Global Health in the Department of Population Health focuses on leveraging education, research and service to advance health equity for people in Central Texas and worldwide.

AMPATH CONSORTIUM

The AMPATH Consortium is a global network of fifteen universities and academic health centers led by Indiana University. The Consortium aims to foster long-term, equitable partnerships with academic health centers and universities. AMPATH Consortium partner institutions support care, training and research based on their areas of expertise, the needs of each AMPATH host community and their capacity.



BENEMÉRITA UNIVERSIDAD AUTÓNOMA DE PUEBLA (BUAP) FACULTAD DE MEDICINA

BUAP was founded in 1578. The Facultad de Medicina has an enrollment of 7,600 students including 6,000 medical students and 1,600 post-graduate students and allied health professionals (nutrition, radiology, therapy, etc.). Post-graduate training opportunities include 22 residency specialties with more than 1,500 residents and two master's programs.



Who we serve

AMPATH/MAPAS México partners provide care in the state of Puebla, México, for a population of 6.2 million people. The city of Puebla is home to 1.5 million people.



HEALTH PRIORITIES

- Diabetes and co-morbidities, chronic kidney disease, cardiovascular disease, maternal health and mental health
- Lack of access to medicine and affordable primary care
- Primary health care workforce strengthening through training and mentorship

POPULATION ASSETS

- Strong focus on family
- Strong connectedness to the land and environment
- Strong social cohesion of the community

Key priorities



CARE

- Launch community health and primary care programs in pilot communities
- Launch mentorship program for social service year doctors (pasantes)
- Develop the capacity of community members in health promotion



EDUCATION

- Advance reciprocal exchange of knowledge and experience through virtual forums
- Establish a clinical skills/simulation working group
- Bilateral exchange experiences for students, residents and faculty
- Education and training on health issues and populations affecting both sides of the border, such as migrant health, comparative health systems and shared epidemiologic burden of disease



RESEARCH

- Form collaborative working groups focused on community-engaged research, implementation science and social determinants of health
- Launch AMPATH/MAPAS México Bilateral Innovation Award
- Characterize and develop the infrastructure to obtain and manage extramural awards



STRUCTURAL + SUSTAINABILITY

- Mobilize financial support and political will to enable systems transformations to address the current gaps in healthcare delivery
