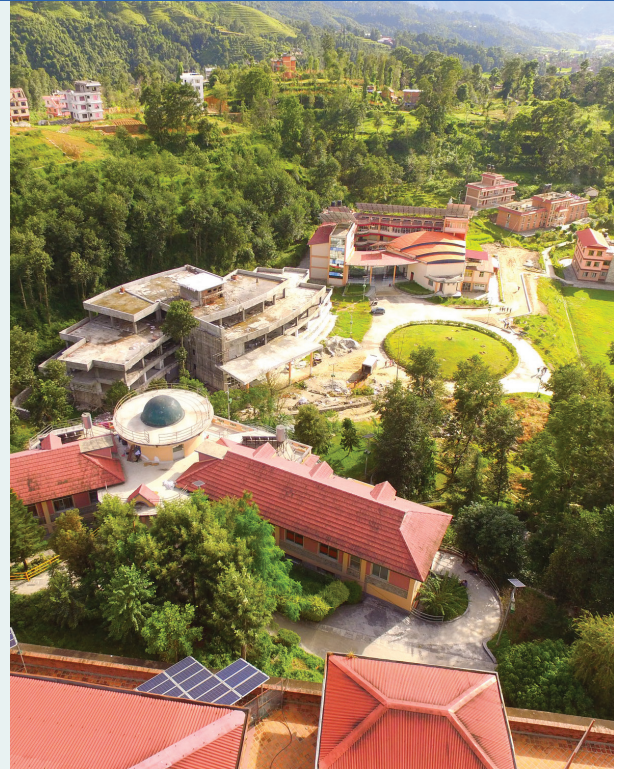


Our mission

DHULIKHEL HOSPITAL (DH)

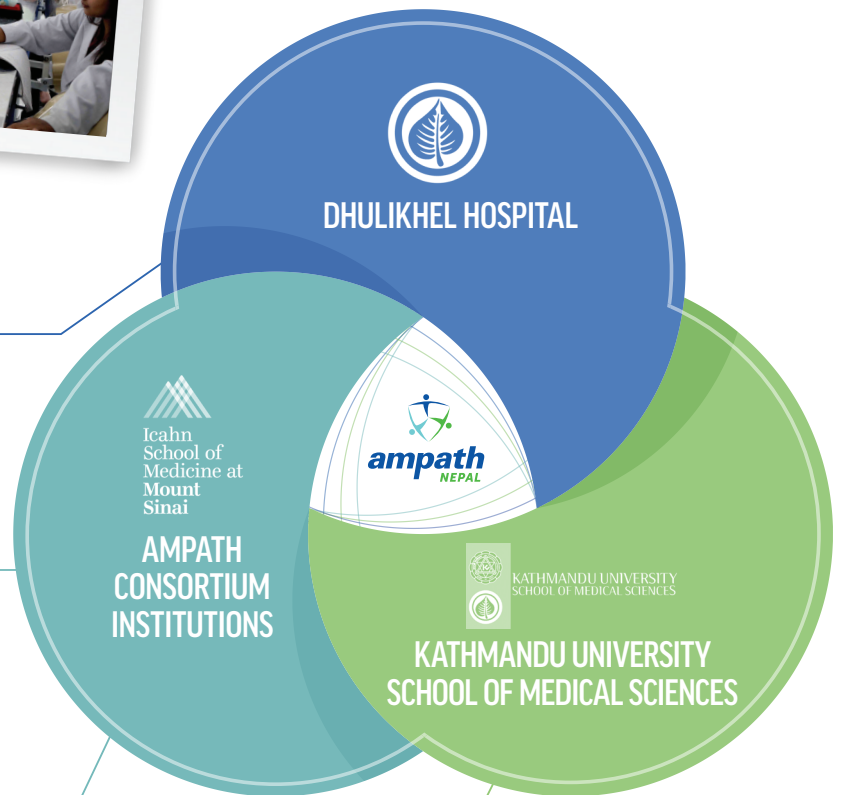
- Founded in 1996

- Has a network of 18 outreach health centers
- Services from advanced surgical care to preventive community-based care

ARNHOLD INSTITUTE FOR GLOBAL HEALTH

The Arnhold Institute for Global Health (AIGH) believes that global health is local health and envisions a world where vulnerable people in every community have access to health care. They are an academic institute that develops and evaluates global health solutions which can be replicated at scale. The AIGH specializes in global health systems and implementation research. Their global research programs generate evidence about how to build and sustain better health care systems.
